Newcastle High School valedictorians share their stories

Spring is in the air, and with social-distancing requirements, graduation is up in the air. After many years of hard work, the class of 2020 has finally reached the end and is ready to start the next chapter in life. However, COVID-19 has drastically changed and postponed these seniors' dreams of walking across the stage, receiving their diploma and together saying goodbye forever to Newcastle High School.

A common tradition is the valedictory addresses, and while the form that the graduation ceremony will take is undecided – whether there will be one at all – the News Letter Journal wanted to give these seniors a chance to share their messages with the community. The class of 2020 has five valedictorians: Tessa Vandersnick, Markie Whitney, Madison Pearson, Dylon Tidyman and Peyton Tystad.

For most of them, the goal in high school was to maintain good grades, but then achieving the status of valedictorian presented itself as a plausible opportunity. "As I sat down to finally write this speech, I had no idea what to say," Whitney said.

"It was clear that senioritis was going to hit us hard," Tidyman said.

Whitney said the class has been through a lot together, but the lockdown "takes the cake." It's strange to her, she said, that when they left school on March 13, she had no idea it would be her last time at NHS as a student. They won't have the luxury of the traditional end-of-year events of most graduates, but on the "bright side," they are starting a new chapter in life.

"No matter what you are doing, it is important to the world," Pearson said. According to Tidyman, the important thing is to live with no regrets.

"Don't give yourself the opportunity to regret not applying to your dream school, applying to that dream job or gaining that dream life because others have said you can't or you don't think you can do it. You will always regret not taking a chance more than you will regret taking a chance and failing," Tidyman said.

For each of them, one of life's lessons stuck out to them more than all the others. For Tidyman, it was to take chances and make mistakes

rather than regrets. For Whitney, it was that she's not entitled to anything but must work hard for what she wants. Pearson said that she's

"Advice I would give to others would be to manage your time and to always work hard," Tystad said. "The most important life lesson I've learned is that you control whether you are successful or not."
